New Haven, CT – Managing three gallery spaces—four when you count the Tiny Gallery outside—can be a daunting task for Creative Arts Workshop. But the work has been greatly lightened by the presence of their first Gallery Fellow, Nick Pfaff. “I had some very powerful resumes come across my desk,” remarks Daniel Fitzmaurice, Executive Director. “I wish we had roles for all of them. But with Nick Pfaff we have someone well connected to the arts in New Haven and someone with experience that will be highly valuable to us.”

Pfaff is a photographer and painter from Hamden, CT. He is an alum of Educational Center for the Arts and earned his BFA in General Fine Art from Maryland Institute College of Art. He has previously worked as a research assistant in the photography collections at the Smithsonian National Museum of American History. Since graduating he has worked on special projects for Artspace in New Haven as well as independent curatorial work and educational outreach programs. In 2012 he was the recipient of a community engagement grant from the New Haven Arts Council. In his spare time Nick experiments with instant film cameras.

Gallery Director Diane Svigals and Fitzmaurice look forward to expanding the influence and excellence of their exhibitions with Pfaff’s assistance.
