FALLING INTO CREATIVITY

New Haven, CT – Creativity starts at 80 Audubon Street each autumn for visual artist from Greater New Haven and beyond. Registration is now underway for Creative Arts Workshop's (CAW) Fall Term from September 21 - December 16. Early registration is highly encouraged due to limited class size. "We're excited to welcome new and returning students this Fall Term for both our favorite and new courses plus a few surprises," says Executive Director Daniel Fitzmaurice. Full term classes in eight departments are accented by a wide array of short, inexpensive workshops typically held on the weekends. One of these surprises is the addition of Open Enrollment to the start of the term from September 21-26. All are invited to sample as many classes as they choose for free during this week to immerse themselves in the creative experience at the Workshop without the commitment of registration. Another is the addition of esteemed artist Ken Lovell to our faculty, offering several new courses that connect analog and digital art: 3-D Paper Modeling, Photoshop for Beginners, and Digital Printmaking.

Over 55 professional artists teach classes at workshops to 2,000 adults in Book Arts, Drawing & Painting, Fiber, Photography, Pottery, Printmaking, and Sculpture departments; and 1,000 students in the Young People's department at the Workshop. Classes are available for students of all ages and levels of experience and are kept small to ensure individual attention to each artist. Students learn in a supportive environment and are encouraged to fully explore their creativity and strive for excellence. Advanced students and professional artists come to the Workshop to learn new techniques and to take advantage of open studio sessions with access to equipment, live models and critique sessions.
