CREATIVE ARTS WORKSHOP
CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS FOR THE 2016 WINTER INSTALLATION

New Haven, CT - Creative Arts Workshop seeks artists to submit a proposal for a very specific installation in their Hilles Gallery during their Celebration of American Crafts exhibition and sale running November 26th to December 24th at 80 Audubon St. in New Haven.

“We’re trying some new ideas on this year,” said Daniel Fitzmaurice, Executive Director. “How can we keep the attraction going during the evenings and days when the Celebration is closed? That’s the spark behind this idea. We are eager to see what artists come up with!”

Artists should submit a written proposal with representative drawings or images of their idea, artist resume and statement, and images of recent work completed within the last two year. Preference will be given to new work with a winter or holiday theme not previously viewed in the New Haven region. The installation will be displayed in the gallery windows or ceiling, but excludes gallery walls and floor space due to the sale.
