CREATIVE ARTS WORKSHOP AND NEW ENGLAND WAX ANNOUNCE JURIED EXHIBITION CHAOS & ORDER

New Haven, CT – A stunning exhibition of new work by 20 encaustic artists will premiere at Creative Arts Workshop, 80 Audubon St. in New Haven, March 13 to April 21, 2017. The opening is Sunday, March 19 from 2 to 4pm with an artist talk at 3:30pm. It is free and open to the public.

Chaos & Order is presented by members of New England Wax, artists who paint with encaustic (pigmented wax) and was juried by Jennifer Gross, Former Chief Curator of deCordova Sculpture Park and Museum.

N.E.W. is a regional association of artists. For the artists of N.E.W., the *Chaos & Order* concept allows the artists room for personal interpretation in terms of meaning, metaphor, and materiality. Although encaustic dates back to the 5th century B.C., artists today are pushing the medium into new uses and techniques, revealing its rediscovered versatility and appeal. The art, however, is first defined by its personal intent and meaning as well as by the interpretation of the theme. Order and chaos are by definition opposing forces, yet the creative process itself contains elements of both order and chaos.

N.E.W., founded in 2006 by Kim Bernard, is a professional organization of artists living and working in the six New England states. Since its inception, N.E.W. has sought to provide opportunities to exhibit, to share technical information and aesthetic ideas, and to build a network of like-minded artists working in the ancient medium of encaustic. The mission of N.E.W. is to promote excellence in fine art made with encaustic, educate the general public and collectors, raise awareness of the medium, and challenge its members to grow as artists.
