Twenty-seven faculty members are featured in the show, representing all the departments at CAW which includes: book arts, drawing/painting, fiber arts, photography, pottery and ceramics, printmaking, sculpture, and young people.

CAW has been growing, and it is particularly exciting to welcome new faculty to this biennial. There is photography by Luciana McClure of *Nasty Women CT*, a painting by Eric March, textiles by Robin Green, and whimsical sculptures by Fritz Horstman, clearly influenced by his work with the Albers Foundation. At the same time, CAW is proud to honor its deep pool of experienced faculty: Steven DiGiovanni's magnificent new oil painting, *Refinery*, is on view along with founder Ann Lehman's new metal sculptures.

"We couldn't be more proud to showcase this extraordinary work by our faculty," said Executive Director, Anne Coates. "It proves world-class creative talent is deeply embedded here in New Haven and is producing great work."

The exhibit runs from September 7th through November 3rd with a reception on Friday, September 7th, from 5:30-7:00 pm.
